What four things did the Jews do when they heard the commandment? (Esther 4:3)

Questions Week 2

Day 6: Digging Deeper

Read Proverbs 29:29 How do we see this truth in this passage? What can we do about it in our culture?

What's your response to seeing injustice and evil around you?

What can Mordecai's response to injustice and evil teach us about our own?
